The Shocking Discovery

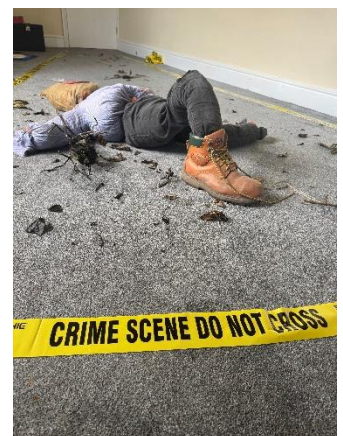

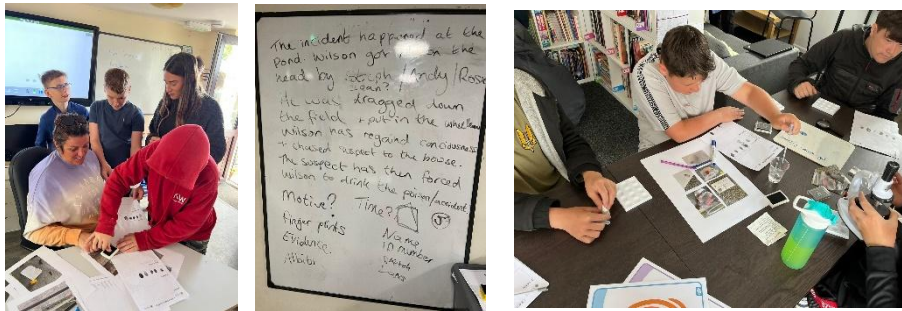

Additionally, the event aligned seamlessly with the promotion of British Values. The principle of Democracy was evident as students collaborated in groups, ensuring each team member's voice was heard when forming theories or concluding. The Rule of Law was reinforced through the investigation process as students worked to uncover the truth while respecting evidence and logical reasoning. Individual Liberty was celebrated as students made independent decisions about their approach and interpretations of the clues. Finally, Mutual Respect and Tolerance were central as students learned to value the opinions and ideas of their peers, even when differing perspectives emerged during debates about suspects and motives.
